CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT

Following is the question submitted to the qualified voters of New Hampshire on November 7, 2000, together with the vote on the question:

(Question Proposed by the 1999 General Court)

Are you in favor amending the constitution to provide that municipalities shall have home rule authority to exercise such powers and perform such functions pertaining to its government and affairs which are not prohibited by the state constitution, state statute, or common law, and that the state shall retain its right of preemption over municipal powers and functions? (Passed by the N.H. House 262 Yes 62 No; Passed by State Senate 19 Yes 3 No) CACR 6

Upon passage of this question the first part of the New Hampshire Constitution will be amended by inserting after article 39 the following new article:

[Art.] 40 [Home Rule Authority Granted.] A municipality may exercise such powers and perform such functions pertaining to its government and affairs which are not prohibited by the state constitution, state statute, or common law. Nothing in this article shall be construed to alter or limit in any way the state's right of preemption over municipal powers and functions.

Twenty-six requests for recounts were received after the general election. Two recounts resulted in a change of winners - State Representative Districts Hillsborough County No. 38 and Hillsborough County No. 45.

The recounts requested from State Senate District No. 1, State Representative from Coos County District No. 6, and State Representative from Rockingham County District No. 21, were called off before they were completed.

Two recounts were appealed to the Ballot Law Commission - State Representative Districts Belknap County No. 2 and Merrimack County No. 9. Neither of these appeals resulted in a change of winners.

Below, in the first column are the figures as officially returned to the Secretary of State. The second column contains the recount figures, and the third column contains the figures after appeals to the Ballot Law Commission. Asterisks designate the person elected.
